Read the following excerpt from <u>Macbeth</u> and answer the questions below.

That darkness does the face of earth entomb When living light should kiss it?

OLD MAN

'Tis unnatural, Even like the deed that's done. On Tuesday last A falcon, tow'ring in her pride of place,

And Duncan's horses (a thing most strange and certain),

Beauteous and swift, the minions of their race, Turned wild in nature, broke their stalls, flung out,

- 1. Situate the excerpt and discuss the events that precede this scene. (6 marks)
- 2. What is the function of darkness as exposed in this passage and as perceived by Macbeth in general? (10 marks)
- 3. Comment on how nature has acted against itself in unusual and alarming ways. How does this idea permeate the play? (14 marks)

PART TWO: Development essay (30 marks)

Write a well-structured and coherent essay on <u>The Handmaid's Tale</u> of between 300 and 400 words on one of the following topics. Indicate the number of words used.

(Do not include quotations in your word count.)

- 1. "I'm sorry there is so much pain in this story. I'm sorry it's in fragments, like a body caught in crossfire or pulled apart by force. But there's nothing I can do to change it."
